

BOARD OF HEALTH MEETING

April 14, 2016 AT 12:00 pm

Call to order: The meeting was called to order at 12:05 pm by David Meyer.

Motion made to approve the minutes from January 14, 2016, supported by Teresa, seconded by Jim. Motion approved.

New Business:

LiveWell Sioux Falls Community Health Needs Assessment:

The community health needs assessment was a shared process with Avera and Sanford's assessments. From the report it was found that 60% of the health of Sioux Falls is impacted by social, environmental and behavioral factors. The CHNA partners identified the following health issues as those that should be addressed through a community-wide effort: Obesity, Behavioral Health and Substance Use and Access to Care. As these priorities are being addressed by each partner there are areas that are being address collaboratively. They include: a community-based Behavioral Health strategies to address behavioral health needs, including access to services, referrals, coordination of care and public education and awareness about mental health. The Live Well Hayward project is a project to address the social determinants of health in the Hayward neighborhood. The Sioux Empire Network of Care is to support development of a coordinated social service system through a community collaboration.

Infectious/Communicable Disease Report:

The Zika Virus has been around since 1947. There is no localized spread in continental US yet. The virus is spread from mosquitos or infected males to their partners. There have been 346 travel related cases in the US and is presenting as a mild illness. Prevention measures are the same as with other illnesses carried by mosquitos. This year there will be a higher potential for West Nile.

Communicable Disease- STI's: Year to date, 2016 looks like it is starting out higher than 2015 per the State Health Department for the Sioux Falls Zip codes. Gonorrhea is up 72% across the state, with increased cases in the Sioux Falls zip codes as well. Chlamydia and Syphilis are also on the rise in the Sioux Falls zip codes.

To counteract these increases the Clinic has included testing for Gonorrhea, Chlamydia and Syphilis to the HIV testing at the walk in clinics for free. Those who have been exposed to these diseases can also be treated for free with the state funding. So far this year there have been 70 more patients tested in regular clinic that last year at this time.

In 2015 the Protect Your Parts webpage was also launched. There are seven condom dispensing sites in the Sioux Falls, Brandon and Tea area. This summer a billboard and radio campaign will launch.
