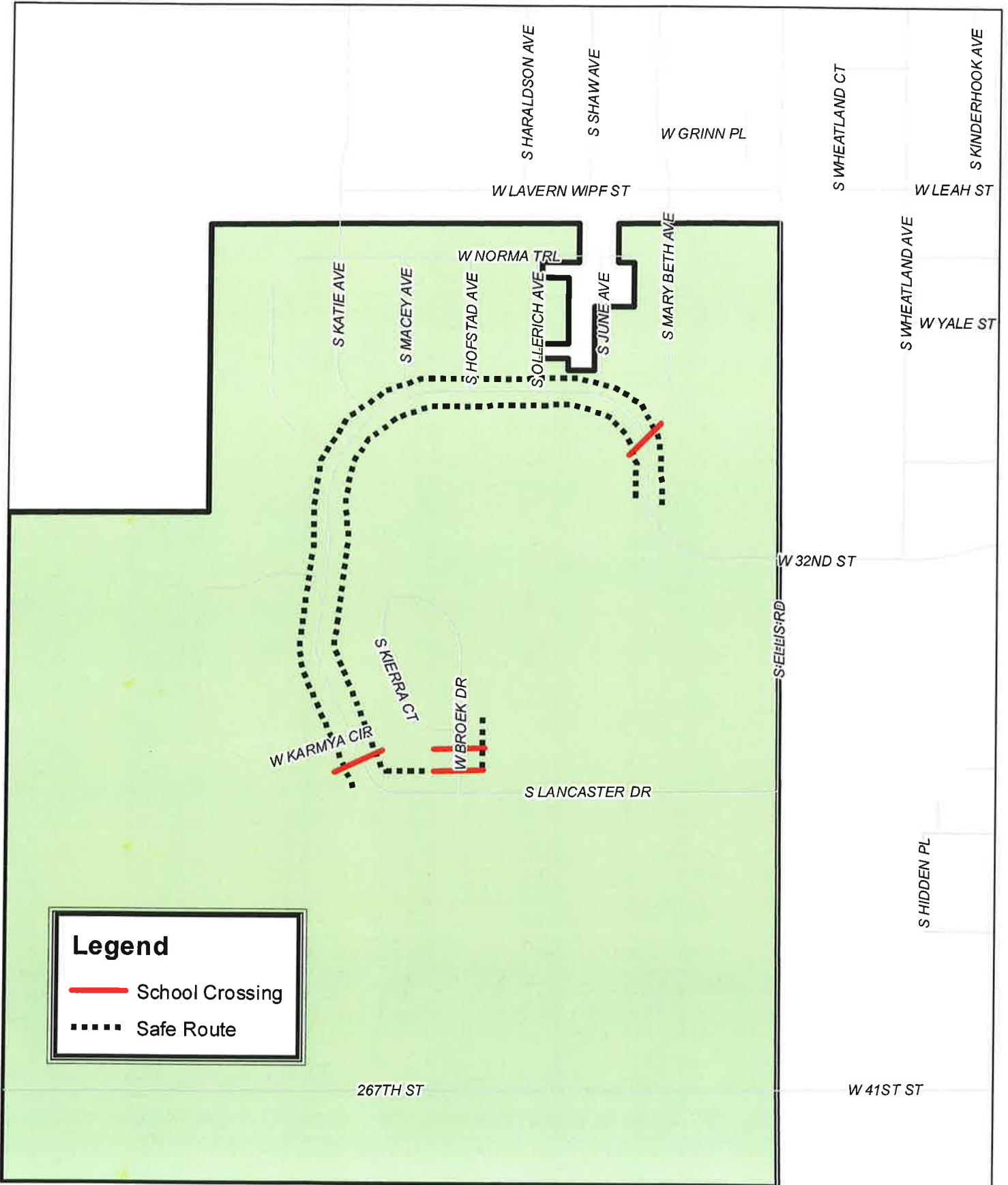

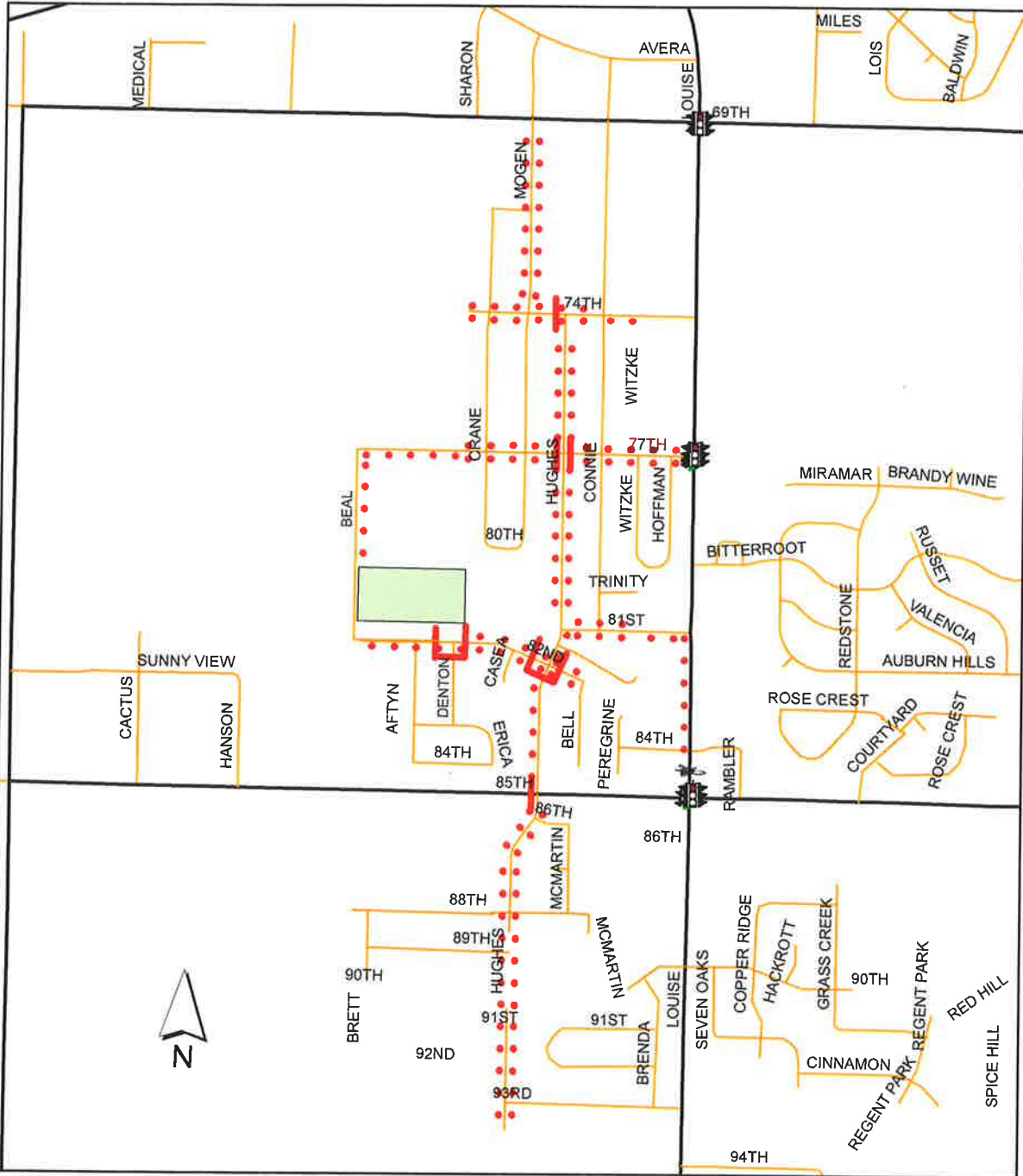





Legend

-  Approved "SAFE" Route to School



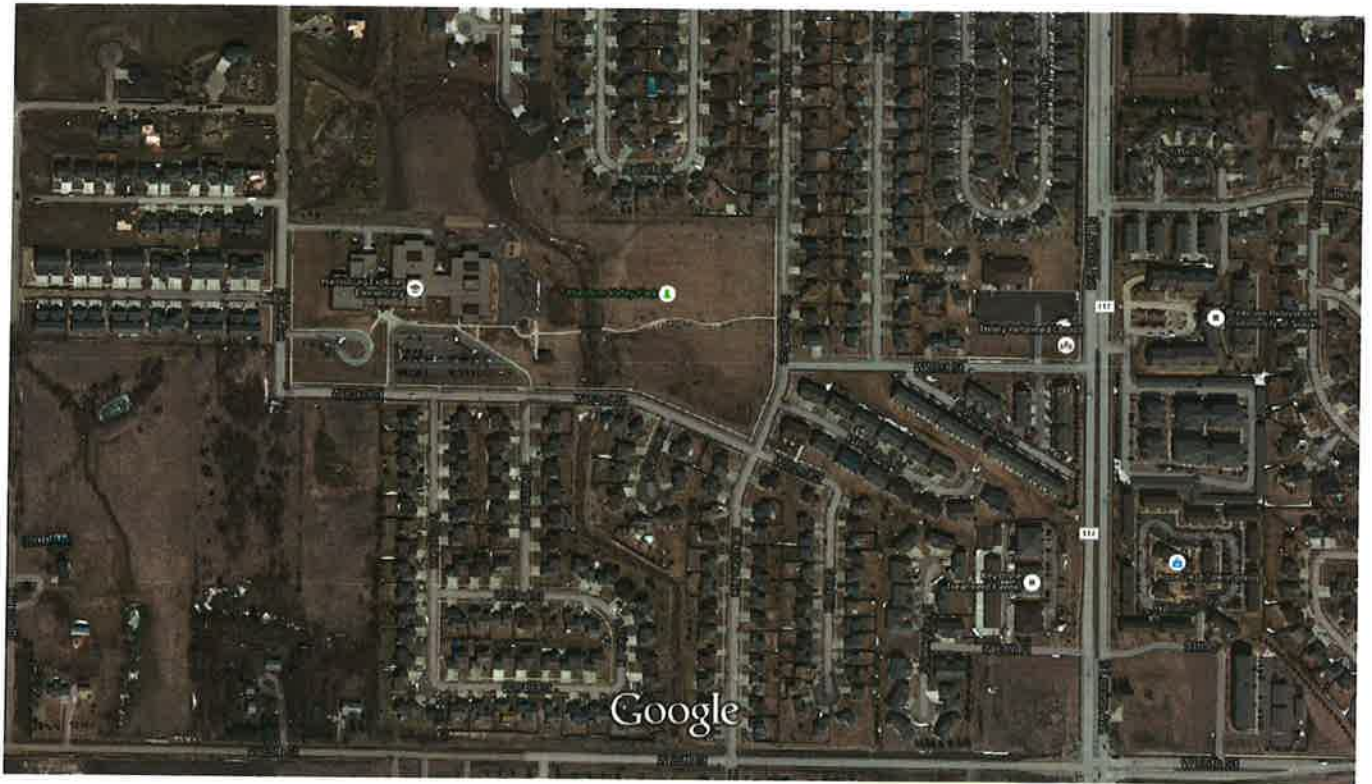
